Placing Bread & Water on Your Home Altar

On many Feast Days during the Liturgical Calendar, Jesus requests His Apostles to place a piece of bread and un-opened bottle of water on their Home Altar so He can come to your home and bless them. When Jesus or Mother Mary announces Jesus will come on a specific date, immediately place a piece of bread and bottle of water on your Home Altar, do not wait for the day before Jesus comes to bless them. Placing them on your Home Altar early will allow you time to see if your bread will mold. Jesus will not bless your bread if it is molding. So if it does mold, throw it away and start again with a new slice of bread.

Bread and Water

The bottle of water should not be tap water, because tap water has many impurities in it. In other countries where water filtering is not as rigid as in the U.S., the water can turn colors and thus you would want to throw your jar of water out. It is best if your purchase a pre-filtered bottle of water to place on your Home Altar (any bottle of water). The bread is very important because it can easily mold. The best choice of bread is either a slice of white or wheat bread. You need to ensure your piece of bread is placed into a zip lock bag and then placed in another zip lock bag. The reason to double bag your slice of bread is to ensure it does not mold, caused by manufacturing imperfections or micro wholes in the plastic zip lock bags.

Molding Bread

Many Apostles have contacted the Apostolate indicating their bread molded. If your bread continues to mold, you can resolve this issue by taking a piece/slice of bread and placing it on your kitchen counter to allow it to dry out. After it has air dried, place it in your zip lock bag and place it on your Home Altar with your water bottle. There are several reasons for bread molding, which are:

- 1. The bread you used was a large dinner roll or some other "larger than a slice" bread used.
- 2. The Lord is letting you know you have demonic spirits in your home. You will need to clear your home of these demons from your home so the bread stops molding.
- 3. The Lord is letting you know you have a ghost roaming your home and the ghost is in need of being delivered from your property. You can achieve this by offering a "Repentance Rosary" for the ghost to be set free and leave your property (read our "Ghost Healing Worksheet").

Home Altar

The placement of your bread and water should be on your Home Altar. If you do not already have a Home Altar, you can set one up very easily. All you need is a flat surface in your home or bedroom, then place your religious items in one spot, where you give Jesus honor. You can have a statue of Jesus and Mother Mary. Jesus said that He would bless any of your religious items, such as: Bible, Rosaries, Chaplets, and pictures.

Eucharistic Adoration

Lastly, if you cannot keep your bread from molding, you should visit Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration and ask Jesus what is causing your bread to mold. Ask Jesus if there is something demonic in your home and to show you an image of it. Close your eyes and pray Jesus will show you the items. If you have any Harry Potter or Disney items in your home, your bread will mold.

Preparing Your Home

Here are a few suggestions to help you prepare for Jesus to come to your home:

- 1. Order a "free" blessed Green Scapular Kit, place 4 of the 14 blessed green scapulars in your home.
- 2. Order a Home Protection Kit (HPK) from the Apostolate to place in the 4 corners of your yard.
- 3. Place 3 Crucifixes above your front/back/garage doors, above door not on door.
- 4. Obtain enough Miraculous Medals (have them blessed) to cover every window in your home.

"Great Famine" Coming

Remember, Jesus knows you and loves you, He will return to bless your bread if it molds but He needs you to know what the molding issue is: demons or ghosts in your home. This is a wonderful gift of grace that Jesus offers us, to realize we have a problem in our home. Jesus has repeatedly told us to prepare for the "Great Famine" which has already started. Jesus has promised that if you place a piece of bread and bottle of water on your Home Altar, He will come to bless them and you **WILL NOT STARVE TO DEATH DURING THE GREAT FAMINE**! Your food and water will not run out, but will sustain you and your family during the famine.

Scripture Promises

Sacred Scripture teaches us that we can "trust" in Jesus to keep us alive during the famine. When the famine began in the Old Testament, the Prophet Elijah blessed the widow's flour, oil and water and it never ran out. Our bread (made from flour, oil and water) and water will not run out either.

Modern Catholic Bible This Old Testament Scripture can be found in 1 Kings 17:8-16

⁸ "Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying: ⁹ Rise up, and go to Zarephath of the Sidonians, and dwell there. For I have instructed a widow woman there to feed you. ¹⁰ He rose up and went away to Zarephath. And when he had arrived at the gate of the city, he saw the widowed woman collecting wood, and he called to her. And he said to her, 'Give me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink.' ¹¹ And as she was going to bring it, he called out after her, saying. 'Bring me also, I beg you, a morsel of bread in your hand.' ¹² And she responded: 'As the Lord your God lives, I have no bread, except a handful of flour in a jar, and a little oil in a bottle. See, I am collecting a couple of sticks, so that I may go in and make it for myself and my son, so that we may eat it and die.' ¹³ And Elijah said to her: 'Do not be afraid, But go and do as you have said. Yet truly, first make for me, from the same flour, a little bread baked under ashes, and bring it to me. Then afterward, make some for yourself and for your son. ¹⁴ For thus says the Lord, the God of Israel: 'The jar of flour will not fail, nor the bottle of oil be diminished, until the day when the Lord will grant rain upon the face of the earth.' ¹⁵ She went and acted in accord with the word of Elijah. And he ate, and she and her household ate. And from that day, ¹⁶ the jar of flour did not fail, and the bottle of oil was not diminished, in accord with the word of the Lord, which he had spoken by the hand of Elijah."

Douay-Rheims Bible

In the Old Testament 3 Kings 17:8-16, the Lord spoke to the Prophet Elijah (Elisha) the Tishbite

⁸ "Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying: ⁹ Arise, go to Sarephta of the Sidonians, and dwell there: for I have commanded a widow woman there to feed thee.* ¹⁰ He arose, and went to Sarephta. And when he was come to the gate of the city, he saw the widow woman gathering sticks, and he called her, and said to her: Give me a little water in a vessel, that I may drink. ¹¹ And Elijah said to her: Give me thy son. And he took him out of her bosom, and carried him into the upper chamber where he abode, and laid him upon his own bed. ¹² And she answered: As the Lord thy God liveth, I have no bread, but only a handful of meal in a pot, and a little oil in a cruise: behold I am gathering two sticks, that I may go in and dress it, for me and my son, that we may eat it and die. ¹³ And Elijah said to her: Fear not; but go, and do as thou hast said but first make for me of the meal a little hearth cake, and bring it to me, and after make for thyself and thy son. ¹⁴ For thus said the Lord, the God of Israel: The pot of meal shall not waste, nor the cruise of oil be diminished, until the day wherein the Lord will give rain upon the face of the earth. ¹⁵ She went, and did according to the word of Elijah: and he ate, and she, and her house: <u>And from that day ¹⁶ The pot of meal wasted not, and the cruise of oil was not diminished according to the word of the Lord, which he spoke in the hand of Elijah."</u>
